Golf Course Maintenance Work

The course continues to show the effect of Butch, Larry, and their team of maintenance staff. The recent rains were kind to the course with no damage occurring. All are reminded that there are rules for where carts should not be driven. Do not drive behind or beside any green unless on the cart path. Do not drive in the woods between holes 12 and 15. When playing a par 3, carts must stay on the cart path. Remember, proper use of carts helps maintain the quality of the course.

Bar and Grille News

The bar will be open on weekends from noon until 6:00 pm and from 3:00 pm until 10:00 pm on Wednesdays and Fridays.

The Grille is open for the season seven days per week.

Attention Golfers

- Do not move tee markers! There have been numerous times when the tee markers have been moved by a member(s). Markers are placed by maintenance staff to balance wear on the tees and are not to be repositioned. Anyone moving tee markers will be subject to disciplinary action by the Board.
- You must start on Hole #1 unless you receive specific permission from GolfShop Staff.

Likewise, if the pool is not being used after 7:00 pm the pool will be closed. Golf Course Etiquette for Improving Pace of Play

Please remember, on those days when we have many playing golf and the pace of play may slow a bit, we as members can help keep the pace moving by:

- Allowing faster groups to play through
- When there is a hole open ahead and the group behind you is waiting, wave them through
- If you are out of a hole pick up your ball.
- When you reach the maximum strokes allowed on a hole based upon the USGA Equitable Stroke Control chart pick your ball up.
